



# Circles of Engagement



**LEADERS**: The people making decisions and coordinating work

**BASE**: The people who come to meetings and contribute in an ongoing way

**CROWD:** The people who might attend a protest or a large event, or read your emails

**AUDIENCE:** People who might read about your organization in a newspaper or on social media

Wide range of capabilities that are useful for organizing

### Relationships

Access to friend groups, partners, institutions, communities, a 'following'

#### **Capacity**

Ability and willingness to show up
