

## WHAT IS DEPORTATION DEFENSE?

---

*Deportation Defense refers to a wide variety of tactics, including legal, communal, and direct action, to stop governments from forcibly detaining and relocating somebody away from their community.*

# THE DEPORTATION PIPELINE




# DEPORTATION PROCEEDINGS

- *Prosecutorial discretion*




# DEPORTATION

---


*When ICE apprehends somebody or transfers somebody for their actual deportation.*

*This can look a lot of different ways:*

- *Whether somebody is in detention,*
- *Or in sanctuary*
- *Or at home.*
  - *With or without an ankle bracelet*
  - *With or without being compliant with ICE check-ins*

# INTERACTING WITH ICE AND/OR POLICE: VERIFICATION

This is different in different places!  
However, some common  
characteristics are:

- Tinted windows
- DHS or ICE insignia; 'POLICE'  
without any department
- Out of state licenses
- American made cars & SUVs



# THE BEST VERIFICATION STRATEGY IS USUALLY JUST TO ASK!

- Knock on their window
- Introduce yourself as a member of a rapid response network, or just a resident in the community
- Maintain a calm and confident demeanor.

## *Questions to ask:*

*“What are you doing here?”*

*“What agency do you work for?”*

*“Do you work for ICE?”*

*“Can I see a badge or some other identification?”*

# Mobilization

---


*After verifying that ICE is indeed present, you need to mobilize more people!*


*Who you could reach out to:*

- *Your Rapid Response Network*
- *Other community organizations*
- *Friends who live nearby*

*You could also consider:*

- *Walking around and knocking on people's doors & telling them and informing them that an ICE agent is outside*





## INTERACTING WITH ICE AND/OR POLICE: DOCUMENTATION

You are allowed to record ICE officers at any time.

- If you are challenged, you can say: *'I am not obstructing you. It is my right to document.'*
- If they ask you to move back, you can take one step back and say the same thing.

Make sure to capture key details like:

- Date, time, location, number of officers
- License plate #s and insignia

At all times	With an administrative warrant	With a judicial warrant
<p>Right to remain silent</p> <p>Right to speak to a lawyer</p> <p>Right to make a phone call</p> <p>Right to refuse to sign documents</p>	<p>Right to remain in a vehicle, home, or workplace</p> <p><i>'I do not consent to entry'</i></p>	<p>Legally allows ICE to enter a non-public space, but 95% of the time ICE does not have this!</p>
