"the practice of studying the history and analysis of struggles for social, political, geographic, and economic power with the explicit purpose of strengthening political organizations and movements for social change"

Why do we care about political education at NAA?

- Democratized org
 - Everyone needs to think about the big picture
 - Start of the skillshare series! People in the org are sharing skills no matter what their official role
- Clarifying a shared politic informs our values (ex: structural change) which inform our tactics (ex: birddogging)
- Unified vision = unified movement



Zoom in on Prison Abolition: Freedom for Immigrants

"Abolitionists study the complexity of the relationships that fuel incarceration. For example, the immigration detention system is not just made up of immigrant prisons and jails that confine human beings. The immigration detention system comprises the transnational and domestic prison corporations, guards' unions, police departments, federal government agencies, and legislatures that make immigration detention possible and profitable. These relationships should be scrutinized, and we should apply the same level of skepticism to them that we apply to other federal government contracts and programs."

Birddogging Training

What is 'birddogging'?

Hunting dogs scare birds into flying, for their allies to shoot down. Thus:

Birddogging is a tactic to create social media content by confronting

politicians.



Push Birddogging (Friendly)

- "Push" birddogging intends to push the target to commit to an action for your side (e.g. signing a petition, agreeing to a formal meeting, participating in a boycott)
- Raise awareness of your issue both in the moment,
 and (through social-media sharing) the wider community

Bait Birddogging

- "Bait" birddogging intends to bait a natural, potentially negative, response from a target who might be opposed to you
- Targeted towards those who have the power to make change (CEOs, business owners, local orgs, educators)
- Goal is to make them look like the unreasonable one



Do you have a potential target in mind?

Things to Consider

- Who has the power to make change?
- Who have you already approached in a "less escalated" way?
 - Who are their competitors and associates?
- Who can you get access to? If your initial approach of a high-profile individual isn't successful, you can apply these same methods for other folks who can be approached for comment.

How to find your target?

- Subscribe to their mailing lists
- Track their public appearances
- Find out their local haunts
- University/School/Association event calendars

Preparation and Choosing Your Question

- Identify target person/company/entity
 - Make sure you know what they look like
- Choose good questions and bring printed-out copies of petitions that resonate with you, and a working pen
- Business cards can be helpful on the intro
- Roleplay before the day is key

The Question Asker



- Polite and well-dressed
- Well-practiced asker
- Bring business cards
- If you bring a petition, it must be accessible to read and be signed
- Firm handshake





- Fully charged cameras, ready to take pics/video
- Highest quality camera possible
- Lav mics are good

- Backup in case something goes wrong
- Bag carrier
- Crowd control

Roleplay time: ice cream for all

You are part of a campaign to guarantee everyone free ice cream in the summer. There's a local town hall that a few state senators are attending.

- Senator Friendly is a potential ally. They've campaigned for hot-weather relief for all citizens.
- Senator Obtuse is in the pocket of big-popsicle. They will never agree to a policy that helps out their donors' biggest competitor.

Let's workshop a "push" question for Senator Friendly and a "bait" question for Senator Obtuse.

Now it's your turn!

Roleplay asking Senator Friendly or Senator Obtuse your question(s)

How'd it go?

Showtime! Approaching your target.

Having chosen your question/petition and practiced it, this is the real thing!!

- Be well-dressed and polite, never antagonistic.
 You want to look like the reasonable one in the video.
- Speak your question clearly, having practiced it and your tone of delivery.
- If you have a petition, make sure you have it on a clipboard, with a working pen at the ready.
- Thank them for their time, and dismount with a calm walk away.

Immediately after the event

Share Video ASAP

- Immediately send to your comms team
- Get subtitles in white or yellow to improve accessibility
- If possible, edit to cut extraneous footage

Debrief

- What were targets like off-camera?
 - This could be its own blog, if your group has an active account on Medium or other public social media posting platforms
- Lessons learned for next time

The online work

The post itself

- Use consistent hashtags
- Tag relevant influencers with large follower counts
- Tag the target, if they have a verified account
 - Watch out for parody accounts
- Tag potential future targets or associates
- Even a non-successful birddog could be a successful post,
 e.g. "Our target didn't show up to answer our questions"
- Patterns of behavior are powerful

Track Commitments

- Start a spreadsheet of people you contact
- For "push" birddogging, keep track of how targets respond
- Follow-up results (or lack thereof) can be a source for more social media content
